



GREEKTOWN CASINO-HOTEL



OVERVIEW

- Located in downtown Detroit's Historic Greektown Entertainment District, Greektown Casino originally opened in November 2000 as the state's third commercial gaming facility.
- In February 2009, Greektown Casino expanded its gaming floor and opened a modern 400-room hotel.
- Jason Gregorec is the chief executive officer and general manager of Greektown Casino-Hotel.

GAMING

- The 100,000-square-foot gaming floor offers approximately 3,000 slot machines and 61 table games including a VIP gaming area and a 12-table smoke-free poker room.
- Greektown Casino-Hotel features Synergy Table Games, a revolutionary approach to gaming that combines electronic table games, live dealer games, and interconnected play in an immersive arena-style setting. Synergy Table Games offers 48 connected play stations with 27-inch video display screens and multi-game capability.
- Greektown Casino-Hotel has the largest non-smoking gaming area in Detroit.
- The GT | Rewards loyalty program offers members rewards like comps, Bonu\$ Play, Bonu\$ Bet, and invitations to members-only promotions and events.

DINING & ENTERTAINMENT

- Greektown Casino-Hotel features four restaurants, a food hall, four bars and lounges, and a coffee shop.
- Monroe Market is a curated collection of culinary experiences in a unique setting reminiscent of a dynamic street market. Spanning 11,000 square feet, the market features six fast-casual eateries situated around a contemporary dining area.
- Signature fine dining restaurant, PRISM, serves mouth-watering cuts of Angus beef, the freshest seafood, Italian specialties and pasta, decadent side dishes and desserts.

HOTEL & MEETING SPACE

- Greektown Casino-Hotel's AAA Four Diamond hotel tower is 30 stories tall and offers panoramic views of downtown Detroit, the International Riverfront and Windsor, Ontario, Canada.
- The modern hotel boasts 10,000 square feet of recently renovated convention and banquet space, including 11 breakout rooms and a 4,000-square-foot grand ballroom.
- Sleeping rooms feature floor-to-ceiling windows, luxurious "sleep easy" beds, 60" plasma TVs, high-speed Internet access, work stations with ergonomic desk chairs, in-room safes, deluxe mini-bars with snacks and beverages, and in-room coffee and tea makers.
- 29 contemporary 2- and 3-room suites feature parlor areas with custom furniture and modern decor, imported marble tile, deep soaking bubble tubs, walk-in showers, his-and-her sinks, and separate powder rooms for guests.

PARKING

- Greektown Casino-Hotel offers parking for approximately 3,600 vehicles in its dedicated self-parking structure and complimentary valet areas.
- All parking is directly connected to the casino and hotel via climate controlled skywalks.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

- Greektown Casino-Hotel employs more than 1,900 team members and is committed to employing, training and promoting women, minorities and residents of the City of Detroit.
- The casino has partnered with nearly 20 local restaurants to offer fine dining rewards to guests.

OWNERSHIP & GOVERNANCE

- An affiliate of JACK Entertainment acquired Greektown Casino-Hotel in April 2013 with the vision to enhance connectivity between Detroit's Historic Greektown neighborhood and the City's thriving business and entertainment districts.
- Detroit-based JACK Entertainment is a recognized leader in the gaming-hospitality industry that owns and operates casinos that connect and energize the cities that they call home. JACK Entertainment has gaming properties in downtown Cleveland, Cincinnati, Baltimore and Detroit and racing facilities in Ohio and Kentucky.
- Dan Gilbert, chairman of JACK Entertainment, is also founder and chairman of Quicken Loans Inc., majority owner of the 2016 NBA Champion Cleveland Cavaliers and founder and chairman of Rock Ventures LLC, an umbrella company formed to provide operational coordination, guidance and integration to his portfolio of more than 100 companies and investments.

HISTORY

- In November 1996, Michigan voters approved Proposal E, which authorized three commercial casinos in the City of Detroit. Proposal E also required each casino to develop and open a 400-room hotel by 2009.
- Gross casino revenues are taxed 19 percent (10.9 percent to the City of Detroit, 8.1 percent to state of Michigan); state and municipal service fees also are levied annually.
- Portions of the tax revenue are designated for public safety, capital improvements, youth programs, tax relief, neighborhood development, and infrastructure improvement.
